METHODOLOGY

This research was conducted to the grade levels with poor academic performance during pandemic at Wawa Elementary School in the academic year 2020-2021. The support program consisted of 35 parents and teachers was held from October 12. 2020 to January 4, 2021. It was conducted once a week. Three first meeting for kamustahan and open forum discussions and the last meeting for general meeting and giving lectures assessing the learners growth though their parent's and teacher's feedback.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSIONS



The graph above showed the positive effect of parents and teachers support programs in the learners' holistic development in school. According to the assessment tool, 60% of the participants strongly agree 20% agree, only 15% of the participants disagree beacuse of their failure to complete the program and only 5% did not cooperate at all during the period of the study.

CONCLUSION

The use of Support Programs for parents and teachers at Wawa Elementary School as part of the teaching and learning process was found effective in promoting students' holistic development in school at this time of pandemic.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- The school should provide support group training and seminarworkshop that would enhance teachers and parents harmoniuos relationship at this difficult and stressing time of tha pandemic.
- The local government unit and other stakeholders should also support and provide trainings and workshops for parents and teachers together to increase parents' involvement in different distance learning modalities.
